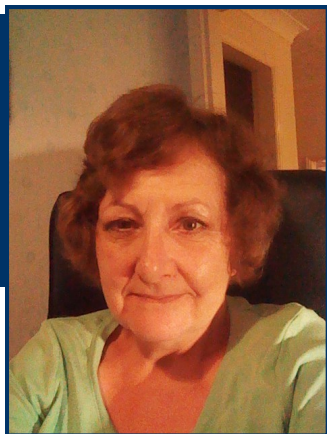


Tutor Profile
